

Home education

- Medication to take home, must be completed
- For the initial 5 days following surgery, it is advised to shower or stand in the bath in order to prevent premature dissolving of suture material
- 3. The dressing should be left in place as per doctors orders
- If it were to come off before the 7 day period is up, no repeat dressing is usually necessary
- Once the initial dressing comes off, no further dressing/ointments or anti-septic solutions are applied.
 Ordinary soap and water together with normal hygiene care are all that is required to get an optimal result
- If the dressing is difficult to remove, sit in a bath of water for a short period of time
- 7. Because the head of the penis has always been covered with skin, it

- may appear very irritated once the dressing is removed this is normal and will improve over the coming weeks
- 8. Continue with normal activities, unless your doctor says otherwise
- Absorbable sutures are used that take around 2 weeks to start falling out. No sutures need removal
- 10. Complications associated with circumcision include bleeding and (rarely) infection. Although a small amount of bleeding from the suture line is acceptable, more severe bleeding with swelling/discolouration of the penis requires immediate consultation
- 11. Patients are advised to refrain from sexual intercourse or mastrubation for 2 to 4 weeks following surgery.
